Lithuanians beyond Lithuania: New Historical Perspectives on Migration and Globalization

This seminar discusses the history of Lithuanian migration from a global perspective. **Egidijus Aleksandravičius** is Professor of History at Vytautas Magnus University in Kaunas, Lithuania, a prominent public intellectual and debater on the past and future of the Lithuanian nation state. Over the last two decades Prof Aleksandravičius has conducted an extensive study of Lithuanian diaspora communities across the globe, from Canada to Buenos Aires, which led to the publication of the first comprehensive history of Lithuanian migration, *Willow Sprout: A History of the Lithuanian World* (in Lithuanian, 2013). Aleksandravičius is also the director of the Lithuanian Emigration Institute at Vytautas Magnus University.



The discussant, **Catherine Gousseff** is the director of the Centre d'études des mondes Russe, Caucasican et Centre-européenne (CERCEC) at l'École des hautes études en sciences sociales (EHESS) and a leading expert in the field of Soviet and Eastern European migration with a focus on the twentieth century. Her most recent study is *Dépayser les peuples: L'histoire d'un échange de populations aux nouvelles frontières polono- soviétiques, 1944-1947*.
